PROFILE

David works in the governance and commercial team in Birmingham at Anthony Collins and leads their legal work with social businesses, including co-operatives, community organisations (including leading on the relationship with umbrella body Locality) and social enterprises. David also heads up their work developing stewardship solutions in the context of new developments.

David led a major project for Chelmsford City Council during 2022 and early 2023, developing a stewardship assessment for the proposed North East Chelmsford Garden Community. He led a similar project for Peabody in 2021, reviewing stewardship options going forward for Thamesmead where Peabody is the major landowner. He also led on their support for Ashford Borough Council throughout the process of establishing Chilmington Management Organisation, in the context of a 4500 home development.

He specialises in community asset transfer and community led housing, where he has led their work with the National Community Land Trust network and is an acknowledged national expert. He delivers high level governance support to a range of organisations, including housing associations in relation to board member conduct and removal and tenant engagement (including mutual models).

David's work began with governance for community regeneration projects and has since developed into supporting all kinds of organisations using enterprise to achieve a social purpose. He writes constitutions and advises on corporate design, as well as advising on contracts, grant funding and social investment. He has extensive experience in establishing community ownership and promoting the co-operative principles through legal structures.
